The new shooting season is now well underway, after a very wet winter and spring, clubs around the country are shooting in Target **Rifle, F Class and Hunter Class.** Fullbore ranges are spread from Invercargill to Whangarei. The National Range is situated in Wellington at Trentham where plans are well progressed towards 2018 National Championships. The following year the World Long Range Championship and Palma Match will also be held at **Trentham. This January/February** sees a run through for 2019, with a lot of overseas competitions expected to check out the facilities and the weather.



The 2018 Nationals this year will host an F Class International Teams event. Australia recently won the F Class Open title in Canada for the 2nd time, so the New Zealand team will have a huge undertaking to compete successfully. Local knowledge and experience will help but New Zealand will still need to be competitive to win the day, as always where NZ and Australia are involved.

Also competing are Veterans Team from Australia and the USA, and here New Zealand has an outstanding record at Trentham having won the trophy the last two years in a row.

Jim Bailey from Australia will be returning to defend the Ballinger Belt he won last year. It has not been won consecutively for 120 years, so this will be a big challenge with a lot of local and overseas competitors involved.
