Welcome to the 2023 New Zealand National Championships. This year marks 100 years since we became the National Rifle Association of New Zealand. There are some special activities planned to mark this occasion plus a commemorative badge. It is actually our 162nd National Championships and the 131st on the best rifle range in the world, Trentham.

There is always a special welcome to our first time competitors at the nationals. Enjoy the experience and make the most of the chance to learn, compete, and pick the brains of the more experienced.

For the more experienced competitors, it is good to have you back again for another crack at a National title, and for a week of good shooting, good company and more happy times.

The F Classes are growing around the country with increasing entries at provincial events. This is transferring across to this event with growing numbers in the classes and tighter competition.

For the first time since the World Championships in 2019 we will have a small group of internationals back, we welcome you.



The international events are getting going again after Covid disruptions. The World F Class Championships in South Africa are now only three months away, having been postponed twice since they were first scheduled to be in 2021. We have a NZ F Open Team of 14 attending. They have been training regularly and are building up well for the Worlds.

The Palma Match and Long Range World Championships are in South Africa in 2024. New Zealand will again have a team attending.

After much investigation of costs and trial work with the electronic targets, NРАНZ has decided not to go ahead with the them for the National Championships. We will be staying with manual marking for the foreseeable future.

Component supply seems to be an ongoing issue. 12 months ago it was powder that we were worried about. It has now moved to primers and to a lesser extent projectiles. The problem is not just a NZ one, but a worldwide one, and the predictions are that it will not change for some time. We place orders with no timeframe available for delivery.

There are a lot of new regulations coming for our clubs and ranges which we all have to comply with. Although they came into effect last June, some have only recently been published, and we all need to be in the new system by this June. We have done a lot of work to try to get workable regulations from what was in parts unworkable when first published.

Enjoy your time at the 2023 Nationals. Take care of yourselves, your members and your clubs for the rest of the season.

Be aware of safety and the security of your firearms at all times.

100th Anniversary



One hundred years ago the National Rifle Association of New Zealand was formed out of the upheaval following the First World War. The suspension of competitive rifle shooting and civilian rifle clubs during the war and the ongoing and somewhat feisty relationship between the Territorials, the Ministry of Defence and the returning veterans caused these groups to take a hard look at the organisation of civilian shooting in New Zealand.

From 1861 to 1877 the New Zealand Government had conducted the annual rifle championship meeting and competitors fired for the champion belt and money prizes in their own districts. In 1866, a colonial rifle meeting was held at Wellington and subsequently at various ranges in the colony. The cost of these competitions had been borne by the Government, but in 1878 “in a fit of economy or indifference”, the Government decided not to hold a competition that year. It was at this point that the New Zealand Rifle Association was formed and held its first competition at Nelson. The New Zealand Rifle Association carried on until 1901 when financial difficulties caused it to reach out for Government support and the name of the association was changed to the New Zealand Defence Forces Rifle Association. This name was changed again in 1911 to the Dominion Rifle Association.

However, the Dominion Rifle Association had both benefited from and been subject to Government support and intervention and when, in 1921, the Ministry of Defence had suddenly withdrawn support for the national meeting, the Rifle Clubs had argued it was necessary to set up a national body independent of the Government. As it was put in the day, the new association did not want to be divorced from the Government but separated by mutual consent and continuing to support the national objective of promoting rifle shooting and national defence.

The New Zealand Rifle Clubs supported the formation of a National Rifle Association on lines similar to those which already existed in Great Britain and Australia. The pre-war emphasis by the Dominion Rifle Association on musketry and meeting the requirements of service shooting were amended. This new Association, the National Rifle Association of New Zealand, aimed to combine as far as possible the requirements of military shooting and the promotion of a national sport.

The first meeting of the council of this new organisation took place on 20th September 1922 and its first national competition took place in March, 1923. The executive of the new Association was largely the same as that of the Dominion Rifle Association and generally the membership showed strong support for the new organisation. Support from the Government of the day in terms of free ammunition, free travel warrants on the railway for competitors and grants also continued to be given to the new Association.

Eventually all of the trophies which had belonged to the Dominion Rifle Association were handed over to the National Rifle Association of New Zealand continuing the rich heritage of competition which had started in New Zealand in 1861 and continues in this centenary year of the National Rifle Association of New Zealand.

Office Hours:

The Meeting Secretary's Office will open during the championship from 8am to 5pm. All championship enquires are to be directed to the Meeting Secretary's Office. Club ammunition payment and uplift is available during office hours.

Annual General Meeting – 2023:

The Annual General Meeting of the National Rifle Association of New Zealand (Inc.) will be held on Wednesday, 11th January 2023, commencing at 7pm. Business is as per the notices sent to all Rifle Clubs.

Venue: Provincial Rifle Club.

Cards:

Score cards are to be signed by the Official Scorer, Check Scorer and the Competitor immediately following the Competitor's shoot. Alterations to the score cards are to be initialled by the Official Scorer. Each competitor is responsible for ensuring his/her completed score card is delivered to the collection point on the range before the completion of the match. Method of recording the conversion of sighters for all classes, is to be in accordance with Rule T9 of the NRANZ Rules.

Checking of Sight Settings:

The Official Scorer is responsible for checking competitor sight settings prior to the start of each match and that each check is recorded on the official score card via the scorer's initials. This is a requirement of Seddon Range Standing Orders.

Vehicle access to the range:

Vehicles are permitted on the range during competition. Only designated parking areas are to be used. The speed limit on the range is **20 km/hour** and is to be strictly observed.

Rules:

Entry is open to anyone affiliated to the NRANZ. Competitors who are New Zealand residents are required to affiliate through an NRANZ member club. Overseas competitors must affiliate to the NRANZ and are required to pay the current NRANZ affiliation fee. Visiting overseas competitors must be a current financial member of a club recognised by NRANZ and are to show proof of such membership on request. Visiting overseas competitors in the Target Rifle Class of competition by default will be entered in A grade. The meeting organisers retain the right to decline an entry. The current shooting rules and regulations of the NRANZ will apply during this meeting. Copies are published on the web site www.nranz.org.nz

Ballinger Belt Final, F Open, FTR Class, FPR & FTR-Classic King's Final Conditions:

The following conditions will apply to the Ballinger Belt Final, the F Open, FTR, FPR & FTR Classic Classes King's final competition should the need arise. In the event of a tie for first place, there will be a shoot-off. It will consist of one optional sighter and five counting shots. The count-back system will not be used to decide first place. ++The number of F-Class in the final has been set by Council as—up to 6 competitors in each class, there are 2, above 6 competitors it goes to 33% of entry in that class up to a maximum of 5. The number of TR finalists has been set as 20% of TR entries to a maximum of twenty. TR place badges will be presented to 20 places. F Open, FTR, FPR and FTR-Classic badges will be presented to 3 places.

Wet weather conditions:

The Chief Range Officer and Match Committee will make decisions to interrupt and restart competition caused by wet weather or other circumstances.

Trophies:

The Ballinger Belt is **not** permitted to leave the custody of the NRANZ and is to stay at the NRANZ office. To acknowledge the winning of the Ballinger Belt, the winner will be presented with the Ballinger Belt Medal. Other trophies can be taken away on loan by the winners, at the conclusion of the prize giving, on application to the meeting secretary. Winners wishing to do so, must sign an undertaking to reimburse the NRANZ for any damage caused to or loss of any trophies in their custody and care. All trophies are to remain in New Zealand.

General Information—continued

Under 25 TR Eligibility:

To qualify for Under 25 awards, competitors must be a current affiliated member, and be under 25 years of age as at 10 January 2023.

Veterans TR Eligibility:

To qualify for NРАНZ veterans awards; veteran competitors must be a current affiliated member and be sixty years of age or over on 10 January 2023.

Tyro Class Eligibility:

A competitor who has not shot in ANY rifle club before 1 July of the previous year can enter as a Tyro.

Schools and Cadets Trophies:

Schools and Cadets Trophies must be collected by a Team Representative at the Annual NРАНZ Prize giving or as arranged with the appropriate NРАНZ Regional Councillor.

Cancellation and Refund of Entry Fees:

Normally entry fees will only be refunded in exceptional circumstances. Refunded entries will incur a 15% cancellation fee.

Ammunition Testing:

There is a 4500 joules maximum muzzle energy limit and competitors may be tested with a LabRadar.

History of the Ballinger Belt



In 1907 Arthur Ballinger won outright the replacement belt with his third New Zealand Champion Title. The replacement belt was then 34 years old and already a venerable trophy. Arthur donated this belt back to the NZ Defence Rifle Association for perpetual competition as the “Ballinger Belt” and it has been placed around the shoulders of every National Champion to this day. The Ballingers were keen supporters of the Volunteer Forces, whilst Arthur’s wins in years 1893 and 1897 occurred during his membership of the Wellington Guards he was also, at that time, an active member of the Petone Rifle Club.

In 1910 the champion’s chair was presented to the NZ Defence Rifle Association by George Hyde, New Zealand 1902 & 1908 Champion Belt winner. Traditionally the winner is ‘chaired’ off the firing point by fellow shooters and carried back to the prize giving area.

The title of New Zealand Champion Shot and the Rifle Champion Belt was known as the King’s Prize. With the death of King George VI in February 1952 and with the accession of Queen Elizabeth II both the title and champion belt became the ‘The Queen’s Prize’. This has continued until 2023 following the death of Queen Elizabeth II and the accession of King Charles III and now the competition will again be referred to as “The King’s Prize”.

Letter from Arthur Ballinger to Colonel Collins V.D. Chief Executive Officer NZDFRA, Wellington, dated January 16th 1908;

Sir, I have the honour to inform you that it is my intention to donate the Rifle Championship Belt won by me to the New Zealand Defence Forces Rifle Association for competition, subject to the following conditions.

1. The belt to be known as “The Ballinger New Zealand Champion Belt”. 2. The Belt to be held by the winner at each Championship Meeting for one year only, and never to become the property of any winner. 3. The Belt to be competed for annually at the meetings of the Association. 4. The Belt to be shot for under conditions similar to these which now govern the Association’s meetings and subject to the proviso that in case of variation of those conditions no regulations similar to those at present known as “service regulations” be included in the conditions and subject to this further proviso that the Belt shall be open to competition by members of the Permanent and Volunteer Forces and Rifle Clubs or Associations for the improvement of shooting in New Zealand and shall not go out of the Dominion. 5. If for any reason no Championship Meeting shall be held within any period of two years under the conditions herein stated, the Belt to be returned to myself, or in case of my death to my executors or administrators.

I have to impose a further condition that the Association pass a resolution which shall be irrevocable save with the consent of myself or my executors or administrators that the Belt is accepted on the conditions stated in this letter. I suggest that in order to prevent any possibility of the terms on which the Association held the Belt being forgotten, a copy of this letter and of the resolution of the Association certified by the Chief Executive Officer be kept in the pouch of the Belt, and if necessary replaced

each year when the Belt is delivered to the winner.

I may say that my desire is that the Belt should afford interest to the Championship Meetings of the Association for all time, and that the condition for its return to myself or my family is not imposed with the desire that it should ever be returned. I have during my connection with the Association extending over half a lifetime, as has my brother during the same period, derived great pleasure from the competitions for this Belt, and I hope the Association will long continue to give its members, and that they will derive the same amount of interest and pleasure in the future as my brother and myself have had in the past.

Team Match Times

300, 500, 600 yds - The maximum time allowed in minutes will be equal to the number of shots to be fired (including sighters) plus 25%.

800, 900 1000 yds - As for short range but 33% added instead of 25.

Elevation Checks

Scorers must confirm elevation settings with the Competitor and check sight elevation settings on the rifle prior to the Shooter taking their place on the mound.

Additionally, the Competitor and Scorer must ensure the rifle's chamber is clear and an Empty Chamber Indicator is inserted before the Competitor leaves the mound.

Score Cards

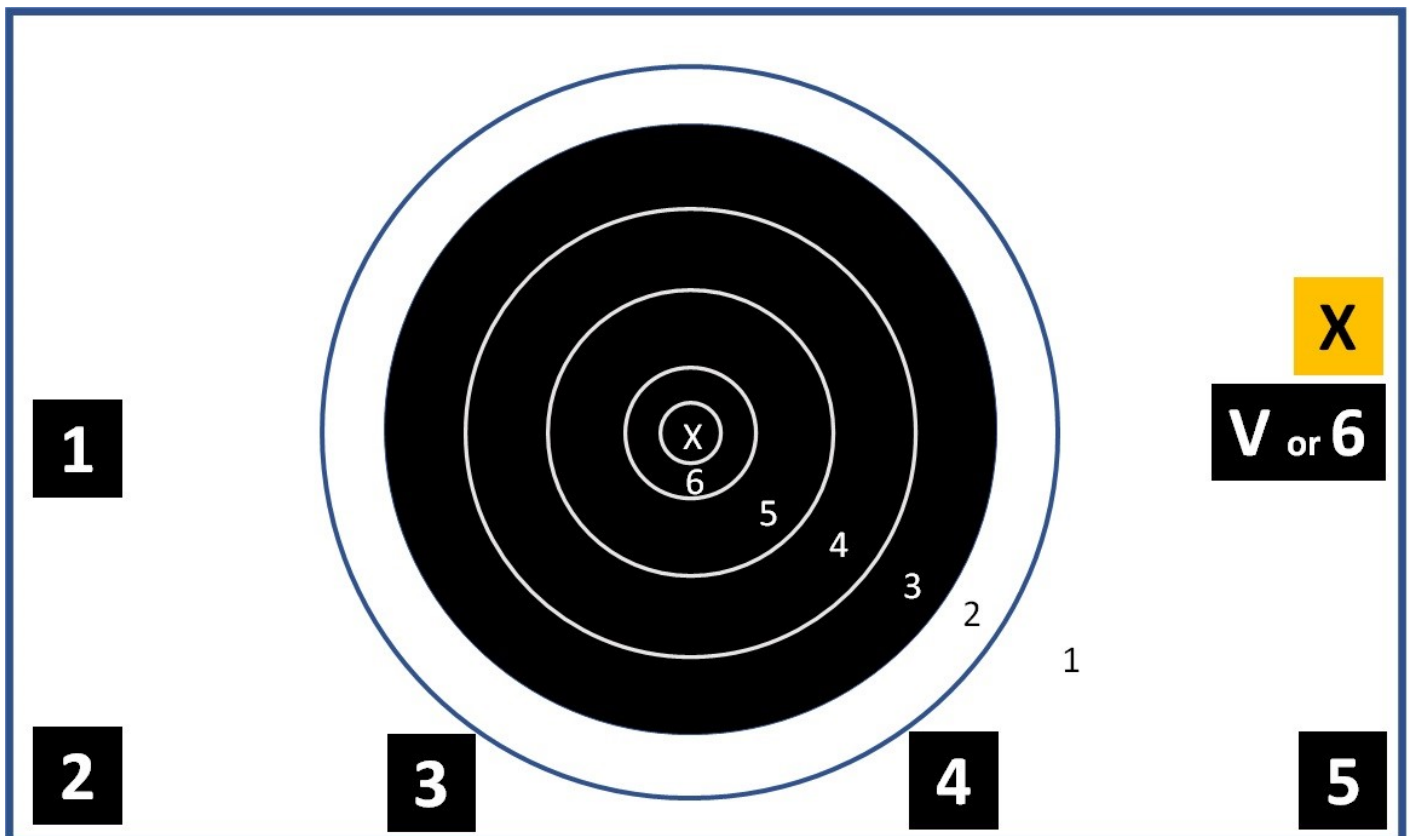
It is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure their score card is placed in the score card tin by the completion of each match.

Empty Chamber Indicators

Empty Chamber Indicators MUST be used on NRANZ ranges.

On completion of shooting the rifle is to remain pointing towards the target, the bolt is then to be removed from the rifle. The competitor is to check that the rifle is clear. The shooter and the scorer must verify and confirm that the rifle is clear by looking down the barrel from the breech end. The empty chamber indicator is then to be inserted prior to the rifle leaving the firing point. All rifles not on the firing point must have an empty chamber indicator inserted.
